
IMPORTANT: If planning to pay your property taxes in person at the Waukesha County Treasurer's Office, please plan accordingly as the County has a weapons screening process in effect. There could be delays in getting through the process depending on the volume of visitors.

Refund Checks will be mailed within 3-4 weeks from payment to ensure funds have cleared the bank. Waukesha County has established a policy of refunding amounts only greater than \$2.00.

Receipts will be mailed to you by Waukesha County. If you are claiming your tax payment on your 2022 Income Tax Return, your payment must be receipted or postmarked no later than December 31, 2022. (Metered Date not accepted)

2022 Property Tax Bill Information

Enclosed you will find your 2022 property tax bill. Your tax bill is determined by tax levies from the following governmental entities: Pewaukee School District, Village of Pewaukee, Waukesha County and WCTC. While your tax bill is sent out by the Village of Pewaukee, the other taxing jurisdictions are responsible for establishing their own budgets and levies. Below is a chart illustrating the distribution of your tax bill, prior to school and lottery tax credits being applied.



Overall, the assessed value of the Village, which is used to calculate the property tax rate, increased from \$1,054,531,900 to \$1,093,761,300. The total Village tax levy increased \$149,535.44 (2.844%) and covers the costs for debt service payments, general operational and Tax Increment Financing District collections. The Village assessed tax rate has decreased from \$4.98/\$1,000 to \$4.94/\$1,000 of assessed value for the 2022 property tax bill. Please note the Village portion of your tax bill pays for services such as; Police Protection, Fire & EMS Services, Snow & Ice Removal, Street Lighting, Brush & Leaf Collection, Library, Parks & Recreation, and other services.

Snow & Ice Removal:

Snow and ice must be removed from sidewalks and public pedestrian ways within **24 hours** after snowfall or occurrence causing formation of snow and ice per Village Code. The Village reserves the right to remove snow and ice that is not

removed within the required time and to impose charges for removal. Snow is not to be placed on any public sidewalk, street or right-of-way in the village.

Recycling Center:

The Village's Recycling Center is located at 552 Hickory Street. The Center is open from 3:30pm-7:30pm on Wednesdays (April – late-October) and from 8am-3pm on Saturdays (April-December). A tag is required for yard waste and can be purchased at Village Hall. A variety of items are accepted at the Recycling Center, including bottles, cans, newspaper, used motor oil and antifreeze, cardboard and yard waste. Hazardous Waste (pesticides, chemicals, paints and cleaning products) is not accepted at the Village's Recycling Center. These items are collected at various sites throughout Waukesha County. Under Wisconsin Statutes, <u>all dogs over the age of 5 months old must be licensed</u>. Your application for the 2023 Village of Pewaukee dog license is below. Fees are \$15.00 for spayed/neutered dogs and \$20.00 for non-spayed/non-neutered dogs. These fees include a \$1.00 charge levied by the State of Wisconsin for a rabies control program. Licenses applied for after March 31st will be assessed a \$5.00 late fee. Valid proof of rabies vaccination is required when mailed in or in person.

If you are applying by mail, the certificate will be returned with your new tag(s). Anyone having more than two dogs must obtain a kennel license in addition to the regular licenses. This does not apply to litters of puppies. Please copy the license

application in order to apply for multiple licenses.

Please include a self-addressed stamped envelope if applying by mail and we would be happy to mail your tag(s).
